- Wedding Albums
- Documents pertaining to your home
- Certificates of Deposit

- Medical & Dental Records
- IRA's
- Car Keys
- Checkbook
- Family Photographs
- Personal Video Tapes
- Bonds

The following list is compiled of items that should not be transported on any moving van due to their potential hazardous nature:

- Matches
- Kerosene
- Motor Oil
- Sterno
- Charcoal
- Paints
- Fertilizer
- Fireworks
- Ammunition
- Liquid Bleach
- Poisons (weed killers, etc.)
- Household Batteries
- Gasoline
- Propane Tanks or other Fuel
- Lamp Oil
- Cleaning Solvents/Ammonia
- Paint Thinner
- Chemistry Sets
- Aerosols
- Loaded Guns
- Chemicals (i.e., dark room chemicals)
- Pesticides
- Car Batteries

The moving company should not transport the following perishable items:

- Plants*
- Frozen Foods
- Produce (fruits and vegetables)
- Refrigerated Foods
- Open or half-used food or food without adequate preservation
